

Road Committee Report

7/27/2021

1. The Road Committee discussed the paving plans for the current fiscal year. We are currently committed to paving Erie Lane, Cherokee Lane, and Hammerstone Lane. We are looking at what additional paving can be done within the budget, taking into account the areas where paving is most urgently needed.
2. For future fiscal years, the Roads Committee is looking at the paving required to finish the North Village, and accelerating the paving of the South Village. As a preliminary step, we have asked the Maintenance Director, Mark Rhatigan, to prepare a list of the remaining roads and driveways that need to be paved, and come up with a cost estimate. When the estimate is complete, the Roads Committee will consider how to best complete the paving project.
3. The sign project is in progress. Mark Rhatigan met with Jonathan Towle to look at the large number of signs at the entrance of North Trail, and agreed on consolidating and simplifying the signage. A few signs deemed unnecessary have been removed. The additional unit direction signs for the North Village are on order, and will be installed when they arrive.
4. The Roads Committee looked at the issue of requests for individually reserved parking spaces for residents with mobility issues. In order to provide fairness and transparency, the Committee has decided to draft a formal policy and procedure for such requests. When we have a finished proposal, it will be presented to the full Tax Board for a formal vote.
