

NEIGHBOR TO NEIGHBOR CLUB OFFERS A HELPING HAND TO OV RESIDENTS

Oronoque Village's newest club, Neighbor to Neighbor (N2N), is available to assist members of the community who are in need of help. Club members are available to take on tasks that include running errands, picking up groceries or medication or providing a sounding board for those who would like to chat.

In the article below, Bahin Samimy, a founder of the club, answers questions about the N2N's formation, its services and its goals.

Why did you start the Neighbor to Neighbor (N2N) Group?

We came together because we all believe there is a need for a group like Neighbor to Neighbor (N2N) in our community. From time to time, everybody needs a little bit of help. Sometimes it can be difficult to ask for help when needed. At OV, many of us have some free time and time is a valuable resource. We want people to know that we are here and happy to help. It is our aim to make it easier for people to reach out in those times of need.

Who is part of the N2N group?

We are Oronoque Village residents who are volunteering our time. We enjoy meeting and assisting fellow residents.

What are some of the questions you are being asked?

Most people ask, "What will this cost?" There is no charge for what we do. We just enjoy being useful to our community.

What are some of the services that N2N provides?

We certainly can do general errands like picking up a few groceries, or a prescription for those who are, for instance, recovering from a recent surgery. We can provide companionship by watching TV, a movie or reading with someone who is homebound. We can do simple tasks, like changing a light bulb. We can help with making phone calls, and we might be able to assist with a minor computer issue.



Members of the Neighbor to Neighbor Club are available to provide such services as running errands or providing companionship to OV residents who are in need.

What things are not part of N2N?

I think it is important to let people know that we are not 911. We do not replace "caregivers" or families. We cannot promise to be there immediately, we may need a bit of time. We are primarily a social group. Neighbor to Neighbor is another way for Oronoque Village residents to connect to each other and build a stronger community, as other such groups around the country have done. It really does take a Village.

Tell me how this actually works?

We have a phone number (203-479-0107) that is manned by group members, usually between the hours of 10 a.m.-4 p.m., Monday through Friday. At other times people can leave a message. There is always a group member who can fulfill a request at some point.

This really sounds like a wonderful group. Thank you, Bahin, for taking the time to share your thoughts and making this great idea a reality.

SCAM ALERT

SPOTTING FAKE DELIVERY EMAILS

Just recently, my neighbor showed me an email message from the U.S. Postal Service about being unable to deliver a package. She was ready to drive to the post office when I pointed out how she could tell it was a scam. In this case, I clicked on the sender's email address. It was clearly not from the USPS. She ignored it and avoided an unnecessary trip. It would have been worse had she clicked on one of the links in the email. Her personal and possibly financial information would have been at risk.

Delivery email (or text message) scams became increasingly frequent during the pandemic as more people shopped online. Many delivery scams start with a text message or an email about delivering a package to your address. These messages often include a "tracking link" that you are urged to click to update your delivery or payment preferences. You might also get a voicemail message with a call-back number, or a "missed delivery" tag on your door with a number to call.

While these messages often look or sound legitimate, you should never click a link or call back the number from an unexpected delivery notice. Instead, contact the delivery service or seller directly using a verified number or website.

The Postal Service, UPS and FedEx all have tips on spotting

scams. On its website, FedEx includes common warning signs of mail, text, or online scams:

Unexpected requests for money in return for delivery of a package, often with a sense of urgency.

Links with requests for personal and/or financial information.

Links to misspelled or slightly altered website addresses, such as "fedx.com" or "fed-ex.com."

Spelling and grammatical errors or excessive use of capitalization and exclamation points.

The Federal Trade Commission has an excellent site about delivery scams - https://www.fcc.gov/how-identifyand-avoid-package-delivery-scams

In my last column, I mentioned that the AARP website listed examples of 83 common scams. This is just one of them. So be very vigilant regarding any suspicious or unexpected emails, texts, or phone messages. There is very little if any downside to not responding. It is always best to call the vendor, shipper, or sender to verify a message you may think is legitimate.



CONNECTICUT SEASONAL FRUITS AND VEGETABLES

Later harvest, shorter growing season, and longer harvest of cool-weather crops define Connecticut seasonality. Exact crop availability and harvest times vary year-to-year, but this summary will help you know when to look for what at markets near you.


